The goal for our LOGOS program is to build Christian relationships, nurture youth and children into a committed faith relationship with Jesus Christ, and prepare them for a life of Christian discipleship.

To reach this goal, we will follow the LOGOS Ministry's four part program. The four parts are Bible Study, Worship Skills, Recreation Time, and Family Time. The four parts are designed to reflect the life of the early church as expressed in Acts 2:42, "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to the fellowship, to the breaking of bread, and to the prayer."

- 1. Bible Study** (apostles' teaching)
This portion of time is devoted to nurturing young people into intelligent, obedient, Biblically informed discipleship using curriculum that is age appropriate.
- 2. Recreation Time** (fellowship)
This portion of time is used to experience great fun at the expense of no one else through games, movement, and activities that require everyone's participation, has no winners or losers, and a score is never kept.
- 3. Family Time** (breaking of bread)
This portion of time is to provide a joyous, Intergenerational celebration of personhood over a shared meal as we experience being the family of God.
- 4. Worship Skills** (prayer)
This portion of time is used to develop responsibility for and practice in worship skills because worship is our primary service to God as disciples.

LOGOS Policies

Parents are a vital part of the success of the LOGOS program. Your example of participation and commitment is the best example for your child. Please become familiar with the information in this handbook and make regular attendance on both Wednesdays for LOGOS and Sundays for worship a priority for you and your child. We would love your help to set and decorate tables, prepare food, clean up and put away chairs and tables.

Discipline in LOGOS

The LOGOS program operates on one overriding principle: *Each of us is a precious child of God. Everyone is to treat everyone else as a child of God and, therefore, no one of us has the right to treat anyone as if he or she does not matter.*

Parents are always welcome and encouraged to inquire and visit with staff and facilitators regarding their child or children's progress and participation in the program.

In the rare event where a LOGOS participant's behavior becomes disruptive to the activity or the class, that participant will be offered the choice to either change the behavior or to take a time away from the activity to consider, with an appropriate designated adult, a way to resume participation.

On occasion, to achieve full resolution of a situation, it may be necessary to contact the pastor and/or the parents of the participant. In working to follow and model the example of Jesus Christ, our Teacher, children, youth and parents are to be and will be treated with respect and dignity.
